## Ms. Chiara Giorgetti

Professor of Law University of Richmond

Professor Chiara Giorgetti serves as the Faculty Director of the School of Law's LL.M. program and teaches and writes in the areas of public international law, international arbitration, and international courts and tribunals. She has authored over a dozen publications on these topics, including several authored and edited books. She is the author of the monograph "A Principled Approach to State Failure: International Community in Emergency Situations". She has also edited the following three volumes: "The Rules, Practice, and Jurisprudence of International Courts and Tribunals", "Litigating International Investment Disputes", and "Challenges and Recusals of Judges and Arbitrators in International Courts and Tribunals". She has written in the Columbia Journal of Transnational Law, the University of Pennsylvania Journal of International Law, the Georgetown Journal of International Law and in the American Journal of International Law.

Professor Giorgetti served as a member of the Executive Council and Executive Committee of the American Society of International Law, and co-chaired the ASIL Annual Meeting. She is Vice-President of the American Branch of the International Law Association, Chair of the Academic Council of the Institute for Transnational Arbitration, and a member of the Academic Forum on Investor-State Dispute Settlement. Prior to joining the Richmond Law faculty in 2012, Professor Giorgetti practiced international arbitration in Washington, D.C. and Geneva, and worked extensively with the United Nations in New York and Somalia. She also served as counsel in several inter-State disputes. Professor Giorgetti clerked at the International Court of Justice in The Hague.
