TEXT OF ARTICLE 13(1)(b) AND (2)

1. The General Assembly shall initiate studies and make recommendations for the purpose of:

...

(b) promoting international cooperation in the economic, social, cultural, educational, and health fields, and assisting in the realization of human rights and fundamental freedoms for all without distinction as to race, sex, language, or religion.

2. The further responsibilities, functions and powers of the General Assembly with respect to matters mentioned in paragraph 1(b) above are set forth in Chapters IX and X.

INTRODUCTORY NOTE

1. The arrangement of this study pertaining to the practices of the General Assembly in the application of Article 13(1)(b) and (2) corresponds with that in the previous studies of this Article in the *Repertory* and its *Supplements Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5* and the material is presented under the same general headings.

2. In the present *Supplement* as with previous studies, the studies under the Articles of Chapters IX and X of the Charter deal with the responsibilities, functions and powers of the General Assembly with respect to matters mentioned in Article 13(1)(b) which, as stated in Article 13(2), are set forth in Chapters IX and X. As in the *Repertory*,¹ the present study is limited to indicating the range and types of actions taken by the General Assembly in the exercise of its functions to initiate studies and make recommendations for the purpose of furthering economic and social cooperation and assisting in the realization of human rights. Generally, only new matters, not covered by earlier studies, are included in this study.

3. There is a close parallel between Article 13(1)(b) and Article 55. As in the past, the study of Article 55 in the present *Supplement* covers the substance of the question of international cooperation in the fields of economic and social activity and of human rights, whereas the present study of Article 13(1)(b) is limited in the manner noted above.

4. The other principal questions dealt with in the studies of the Articles of Chapters IX and X are as follows:

Articles 60 and 66: The relative responsibilities of the General Assembly and the Economic and Social Council in the discharge of the function of the United Nations as set forth in Chapter IX;

Article 61: The election by the General Assembly of members of the Economic and Social Council;

Article 62(3): The preparation of conventions for submission to the General Assembly;

Article 66(2): The performance of services;

Article 59: The creation of new specialized agencies;

Articles 57 and 63(1): The establishment of relationships with specialized agencies;

Articles 58 and 63(2): The coordination of activities of the specialized agencies.

5. During the period under review, explicit reference was made to Article 13(1)(b) in General Assembly resolution 35/174 dealing with alternative approaches and ways and means within the United Nations system for improving the effective enjoyment of human rights and fundamental freedoms.²

I. SUMMARY OF PRACTICE

A. Studies initiated by the General Assembly

6. The present study reviews studies initiated by the General Assembly under Article 13(1)(b) at the thirty-fourth, thirty-fifth, thirty-sixth, thirty-seventh, thirty-eighth and thirty-ninth sessions, as well as the special and emergency special sessions. To provide an

overview of these studies, the annex provides a table with the following headings:

I. Studies requested from the Economic and Social Council and its subsidiary organs;

II. Studies requested from the Secretary-General;

III. Studies requested from other bodies and individual specialized agencies;

IV. Studies requested from several bodies jointly;

V. Studies requested from Member States.

In each case, the listing in the annex includes the number, the title and the pertinent provisions of the resolution.

B. Recommendations of the General Assembly

7. During the period under review, the General Assembly adopted 1465 resolutions, out of which approximately 740 included recommendations constituting an application of Article 13(1)(b) since they dealt with the promotion of international cooperation in economic, social and related fields or with assistance in the promotion of fundamental human rights or fundamental freedoms. As in the past, the Assembly used a wide range of terms in making its recommendations, which were addressed to various organs and agencies of the United Nations system for international cooperation, subsidiary bodies of the General Assembly and the Economic and Social Council as well as other intergovernmental bodies, Member States and non-governmental organizations. A variety of actions was proposed, ranging from studies, reports and periodic appraisals to the implementation of resolutions adopted by the General Assembly, the ratification of various conventions, the enactment of national legislation in support of declarations proclaimed and the adoption of measures which would contribute to higher standards of living, full employment, conditions of economic and social progress and development, and the promotion of human rights and fundamental freedoms.

8. An overview under the following four subheadings illustrates the trends regarding terminology, addressees, the subject matter and actions envisaged of recommendations during this period.

1. TERMINOLOGY

9. As in previous *Supplements* and the *Repertory*, there was no consistent pattern in the terminology of the resolutions. Such words as "recommends", "requests", "supports", "invites", "appeals", "urges" and "encourages" were most frequently used.³ As in the past, terms such as "endorses", "approves", "authorizes", "resolves", and "instructs" were applied.⁴

10. During the period under review, the General Assembly, in expressing its concern and indignation, also used terms such as "appalled",⁵ "gravely alarmed",⁶ "vehemently condemns",⁷ "deeply disturbed",⁸ "deplores",⁹ "strongly condemns",¹⁰ "warns",¹¹ "deeply concerned",¹² "notes with

particular concern",¹³ "gravely concerned",¹⁴ as well as "denounces",¹⁵ "indignant",¹⁶ "deeply indignant"¹⁷ and "expresses its profound indignation".¹⁸ The Assembly also used such terms as "expresses its desire",¹⁹ "strongly desirous",²⁰ and "demands"²¹ as well as "firmly rejects".²² To reiterate previous requests and convictions, the General Assembly used a variety of terms, including "calls once again upon",²³ "reaffirms",²⁴ "renews its appeal",²⁵ "determines once more",²⁶ "urgently reiterates the appeal",²⁷ "again demands",²⁸ "reaffirms its convictions",²⁹ and "reiterates its firm conviction".³⁰ The Assembly also used a variety of terms to note its approval, such as "expresses its appreciation",³¹ "takes note with satisfaction",³² "notes with deep appreciation",³³ and "commends".³⁴

2. ADDRESSEES

11. As in the past, some recommendations of the General Assembly under this Article were addressed generally, while others addressed specific entities. Most of the General Assembly's recommendations under this Article were addressed to Member States, their Governments, subsidiary bodies of the General Assembly as well as of the Economic and Social Council, the Council itself, the Secretary-General, the specialized agencies and other bodies of the United Nations system. Recommendations were also addressed to the Security Council during this period.³⁵ As in the previous *Supplement*, some of the recommendations were addressed to the governing body of the organization or agency, while others were addressed to its executive head. Recommendations were also made to the international community, intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations, organizations and programmes within the United Nations system, competent secretariats at the sectoral and regional levels, competent international financial and credit institutions, the developed market economy countries, sponsoring agencies, the contracting parties to a particular agreement, individuals,³⁶ and working groups and preparatory committees appointed for specific purposes.

12. During the period under review, recommendations were also addressed to various bodies, institutions and individuals, including the Committee on Natural Resources,³⁷ all mass media and cultural and educational institutions,³⁸ the Conference on the Indian Ocean,³⁹ the United Nations Institute for Training and Research,⁴⁰ transit countries (for landlocked countries),⁴¹ the secretariat of the World Food Council,⁴² the Governing Council of the United Nations Environment Programme,⁴³ the Commission on Human Settlements and the United Nations Centre for Human Settlements,⁴⁴ the Director-General for Development and International

Economic Cooperation,⁴⁵ Mr. Henry R. Labouisse (for almost 15 years of distinguished service as the Executive Director of the United Nations Children's Fund),⁴⁶ the United Nations Postal Administration,⁴⁷ the Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme,⁴⁸ the United Nations Fund for Population Activities,⁴⁹ the Population Commission,⁵⁰ the Advisory Committee for the International Youth Year,⁵¹ the Commission on Narcotic Drugs,⁵² the Government of Argentina and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland,⁵³ the Government of South Africa, transnational corporations and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the United States of America, the Federal Republic of Germany, France, Japan, Belgium, Israel and Italy,⁵⁴ the United Nations Conciliation Commission for Palestine,⁵⁵ the United Nations Council for Namibia,⁵⁶ the United Nations Sudano-Sahelian Office,⁵⁷ the Economic Commission for Africa⁵⁸ and the Special Committee against Apartheid.⁵⁹

13. Recommendations involving specialized agencies included those addressed to the Director-General of the World Health Organization,⁶⁰ the World Health Organization,⁶¹ the Director-General of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations,⁶² the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations,⁶³ the International Labour Organization,⁶⁴ the World Bank,⁶⁵ the International Monetary Fund,⁶⁶ the International Fund for Agricultural Development,⁶⁷ the Inter-Governmental Maritime Consultative Organization,⁶⁸ the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization⁶⁹ and the Director-General of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization.⁷⁰

3. SUBJECTS DEALT WITH IN THE RECOMMENDATIONS

14. The General Assembly continued to make requests and recommendations on subjects that had engaged its attention in the previous period. These included the United Nations Institute for Training and Research,⁷¹ population questions,⁷² United Nations volunteers,⁷³ multilateral food aid,⁷⁴ permanent sovereignty over national resources in the occupied Palestinian and other Arab territories,⁷⁵ the subject of natural resources, including the United Nations Revolving Fund for their exploration,⁷⁶ development and utilization of new and renewable sources of energy,⁷⁷ development of the energy resources of developing countries,⁷⁸ and interrelationships between resources, environment, people and development,⁷⁹ reverse transfer of technology,⁸⁰ the

role of qualified national personnel in the social and economic development of developing countries,⁸¹ economic and social consequences of the armaments race⁸² and the United Nations Capital Development Fund.⁸³

(a) *Subjects from prior periods given a new or more defined focus*

15. The General Assembly continued to make recommendations giving a new or more defined focus to matters it had addressed prior to the period under review. Recommendations were made with regard to the industrial development of developing countries, especially the conversion of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization into a specialized agency,⁸⁴ and the Industrial Development Decade for Africa.⁸⁵ Consideration of questions related to housing, building and planning resulted in the Assembly making recommendations with regard to, inter alia, the strengthening of human settlements activities,⁸⁶ the establishment of the United Nations Audio-Visual Information Centre on Human Settlements (Vision Habitat),⁸⁷ the International Year of Shelter for the Homeless⁸⁸ and renewable sources of energy for human settlements.⁸⁹ Concerning the earlier proposal to establish a University for Peace,⁹⁰ the General Assembly decided to follow through on the proposal, and the University of Peace was established during the current reporting period.⁹¹

16. In the case of women, recommendations were made regarding the improvement of their situation in rural areas,⁹² their role in public life and society,⁹³ the prevention of prostitution,⁹⁴ the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women,⁹⁵ the World Conference of the United Nations Decade for Women⁹⁶ and the Declaration on the Participation of Women in Promoting International Peace and Cooperation.⁹⁷ The subject of youth remained on the agenda of the General Assembly, which made recommendations regarding the International Youth Year,⁹⁸ the policies and programmes relating to youth,⁹⁹ the channels of communication between the United Nations and youth and youth organizations¹⁰⁰ and the right to education and to work for youth.¹⁰¹ Concerning the question of the elderly and the aged, the General Assembly focused attention and made recommendations with respect to the World Assembly on Aging,¹⁰² a "Day for the Aging"¹⁰³ and the International Plan of Action on Aging.¹⁰⁴ In the case of disabled persons, attention was focused on the International Year of Disabled Persons,¹⁰⁵ the World Programme of Action concerning Disabled Persons¹⁰⁶ and the United Nations Decade of Disabled

Persons.¹⁰⁷ With regard to migrant workers, the General Assembly decided to work on elaborating an international convention on the protection of the rights of all migrant workers and their families.¹⁰⁸

17. Focus shifted from a specific country situation to a broader scope when the existing mandate of the United Nations Trust Fund for Chile was extended and the fund was redesignated as the United Nations Voluntary Fund for Victims of Torture.¹⁰⁹ Under the resolutions dealing with alternative approaches and ways and means within the United Nations system for improving the effective enjoyment of human rights and fundamental freedoms, the General Assembly continued to consider the issue of whether to create a post of United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights; and for the first time, the right to development as a human right.¹¹⁰ Furthermore, the period under review saw the establishment of the Working Group of Governmental Experts on the Right to Development, whose aim was to present a draft resolution on the right to development as soon as possible.¹¹¹

18. Questions relating to narcotic drugs were also given more importance during the period. Recommendations were made on international drug abuse control strategy and policies, while the Declaration on the Control of Drug Trafficking and Drug Abuse was adopted, and the General Assembly requested that work begin on a draft convention against traffic in narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances and related activities.¹¹² Various questions related to criminality, crime prevention and control included the endorsement of the Caracas Declaration, work on new guiding principles on crime prevention and criminal justice in the context of development, and human rights in the administration of justice.¹¹³

19. With regard to the conservation of nature and the protection of the environment, attention centred on the preparation of the United Nations System Medium-Term Environment Programme and the Perspective Document¹¹⁴ and the historical responsibility of States for the preservation of nature for present and future generations¹¹⁵ and built on the Declaration of the United Nations Conference on the Human Environment by promoting the development of international law regarding cooperation in the environmental field concerning natural resources shared by two or more States.¹¹⁶ Additionally, the World Charter for Nature was drafted and adopted¹¹⁷ and the preparatory process for the Environmental Perspective to the Year 2000 and Beyond was set in place.¹¹⁸ Concerning the subject of water resources development, the General Assembly proclaimed the

period 1981-1990 as the International Drinking Water Supply and Sanitation Decade.¹¹⁹

(b) *New subjects*

20. Many new subjects were also considered by the General Assembly and recommendations made thereon. These included, inter alia, the establishment of a new, more just and more effective world information and communication order,¹²⁰ the exchange of information on banned hazardous chemicals and unsafe pharmaceutical products,¹²¹ protection against products harmful to health and the environment,¹²² the International Development Strategy for the Third United Nations Development Decade and its periodic review and appraisal,¹²³ the review of the implementation of the Charter of Economic Rights and Duties of States,¹²⁴ the situation in Kampuchea,¹²⁵ the question of international legal protection of the human rights of individuals who are not citizens of the country in which they live,¹²⁶ and the idea of elaborating a draft second optional protocol to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, aiming at the abolition of the death penalty.¹²⁷

(c) *Subjects of a predominantly economic nature*

21. Subjects of a predominantly economic nature on which the General Assembly made recommendations included examination of long-term trends in economic development,¹²⁸ the role of the public sector in promoting the economic development of developing countries,¹²⁹ international economic cooperation for development,¹³⁰ international cooperation to combat desertification,¹³¹ acceleration of the transfer of real resources to developing countries,¹³² an international code of conduct on the transfer of technology,¹³³ effects of the world inflationary phenomenon on the development process,¹³⁴ multilateral trade negotiations,¹³⁵ economic cooperation among developing countries,¹³⁶ replenishment of the International Development Association and recapitalization of the World Bank,¹³⁷ proposals for the new international development strategy,¹³⁸ international monetary reform,¹³⁹ science and technology for development,¹⁴⁰ the establishment of the Common Fund for Commodities,¹⁴¹ restrictive business practices,¹⁴² consideration of the draft articles on most-favoured-nation clauses,¹⁴³ mobilization of personal savings,¹⁴⁴ international trade in textiles,¹⁴⁵ negative trends in the world economy,¹⁴⁶ immediate measures in favour of the developing countries,¹⁴⁷ confidence-building in international economic relations,¹⁴⁸ economic measures as a means of political and economic

coercion against developing countries,¹⁴⁹ economic development projects in the occupied Palestinian territories¹⁵⁰ and the Declaration on the Critical Economic Situation in Africa.¹⁵¹

(d) *Subjects in the area of social progress and development*

22. In the area of social progress and development, subjects on which the General Assembly made recommendations included the International Year of the Child,¹⁵² assistance in cases of natural disasters and other disasters,¹⁵³ including strengthening the capacity of the United Nations system to respond to those situations,¹⁵⁴ health as an integral part of development¹⁵⁵ as well as the Global Strategy for Health for All by the Year 2000,¹⁵⁶ the return or restitution of cultural property to the countries of origin as part of the preservation and further development of cultural values,¹⁵⁷ questions relating to food,¹⁵⁸ including the critical situation of food and agriculture in Africa,¹⁵⁹ the World Conference on Fisheries Management and Development,¹⁶⁰ the establishment of a University for Peace,¹⁶¹ the United Nations University,¹⁶² the world social situation,¹⁶³ social aspects of the development activities of the United Nations¹⁶⁴ and consumer protection.¹⁶⁵

(e) *Subjects in the area of human rights and fundamental freedoms*

23. With respect to human rights and fundamental freedoms during the period, there was a growing trend in this area of Assembly recommendations. Subjects covered by the Assembly included alternative approaches and ways and means within the United Nations system for the improvement of the effective enjoyment of human rights and fundamental freedoms,¹⁶⁶ the implementation of the right to education,¹⁶⁷ the question of a convention on the rights of the child and the draft declaration on social and legal principles relating to the foster placement and adoption of children nationally and internationally,¹⁶⁸ the right of *amparo*, habeas corpus or other similar legal remedies,¹⁶⁹ arbitrary or summary executions,¹⁷⁰ the question of enforced or involuntary disappearances,¹⁷¹ measures to improve the situation and ensure the human rights and dignity of all migrant workers,¹⁷² human rights and scientific and technological developments,¹⁷³ a new international humanitarian order,¹⁷⁴ the United Nations Trust Fund for Chile as well as the United Nations Voluntary Fund for Victims of Torture,¹⁷⁵ the question of human rights relating to the case of Mr. Ziad Abu Eain,¹⁷⁶ popular participation as an important factor in development and in the full realization of all human rights¹⁷⁷ and the Second

Decade to Combat Racism and Racial Discrimination.¹⁷⁸ On the issue of refugees, recommendations were made regarding their situation,¹⁷⁹ in addition to refugee and displaced women,¹⁸⁰ refugee and displaced children¹⁸¹ international cooperation to avert new flows of refugees,¹⁸² human rights and mass exoduses,¹⁸³ and the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East.¹⁸⁴ Recommendations also included the situation of human rights in such countries as Chile,¹⁸⁵ Bolivia,¹⁸⁶ El Salvador¹⁸⁷ and Guatemala.¹⁸⁸ Moreover, during the period, the General Assembly continued its consideration of the Report of the Special Committee to Investigate Israeli Practices Affecting the Human Rights of the Population of the Occupied Territories.¹⁸⁹

24. The subject of human rights and fundamental freedoms as contained in several conventions, declarations and sets of principles also engaged the attention of the General Assembly. During the period under review, conventions adopted by the General Assembly and opened for signature, ratification and accession included the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women¹⁹⁰ and the Convention against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment.¹⁹¹ Declarations proclaimed dealing with this subject area during the period included those on the elimination of all forms of religious intolerance¹⁹² and on South Africa.¹⁹³ Subjects covered in principles and codes included the Principles of Medical Ethics relevant to the role of health personnel, particularly physicians, in the protection of prisoners and detainees against torture and other cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment,¹⁹⁴ and the Code of Conduct for Law Enforcement Officials.¹⁹⁵

(f) *Subjects of a general character for international action in promoting economic and social development*

25. Recommendations of a more general character for international action to promote economic and social development were made by the General Assembly on such subjects as landlocked countries,¹⁹⁶ the least developed among the developing countries,¹⁹⁷ developing island countries,¹⁹⁸ the most seriously affected countries,¹⁹⁹ financial resources of the United Nations Development Programme²⁰⁰ and a unified approach to development analysis and planning.²⁰¹

(g) *Other subjects*

26. Other subjects included the Transport and Communications Decade in Africa,²⁰² the World Communications Year,²⁰³ technical cooperation in general as well as that among developing countries,²⁰⁴ dissemination of information and mobilization of public opinion,²⁰⁵ the restructuring of the economic and social sectors of the United Nations system,²⁰⁶ special measures for the social and economic development of Africa in the 1980s,²⁰⁷ operational activities for development,²⁰⁸ national experience in promoting the cooperative movement,²⁰⁹ national experience in achieving far-reaching social and economic changes for the purpose of social progress,²¹⁰ development and international economic cooperation²¹¹ and the Transport and Communications Decade for Asia and the Pacific.²¹²

4. TYPES OF ACTION ENVISAGED IN THE RECOMMENDATIONS

(a) *General*

27. In addition to the studies enumerated in the annex to the present study, various types of action were requested from or recommended to Member States, the specialized agencies, subsidiary bodies of the General Assembly and the Economic and Social Council, other organs of the United Nations system, the Secretary-General and even the international community as a whole. Most common were to "adopt measures", "pursue efforts" or "continue to intensify efforts", "give continuing attention to", "take all necessary steps" or "take appropriate and effective measures", "implement fully" measures proposed in particular resolutions, "strengthen and enlarge the scope of activities", "provide appropriate support", "take into consideration" and "give special attention to" policies and programmes endorsed by the General Assembly. In many instances the Member States and organizations in the United Nations system were urged to provide, as a matter of urgency, the necessary assistance to some Governments or peoples.²¹³ In many other instances they were called upon to ratify and ensure the speedy implementation of declarations, conventions and plans of action adopted by the General Assembly.²¹⁴

(b) *Other actions proposed to Member States*

28. Other actions proposed to Member States included the adoption of legislative, administrative and other measures for a specific purpose. These types of actions were particularly relevant in enabling the realization or protection of human rights and fundamental freedoms.²¹⁵ For example, all States were called upon to adopt, as a matter of high

priority, measures declaring punishable by law any dissemination of ideas based on racial superiority or hatred and outlawing organizations established on the basis of racial criteria or propagating ideas of racial discrimination and apartheid.²¹⁶ Additionally, in response to the policies of apartheid of the Government of South Africa, the General Assembly recommended actions such as comprehensive and mandatory sanctions against South Africa as well as cultural, academic and other boycotts.²¹⁷ In another example the General Assembly called upon all Governments to guarantee to persons within their jurisdiction the full enjoyment of the right of *amparo*, habeas corpus or other similar legal remedies, as might be applicable in their legal system.²¹⁸ All States were also called upon to take necessary measures to ensure that the results of scientific and technological progress were used exclusively in the interests of international peace, for the benefit of mankind and for promoting and encouraging respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms.²¹⁹ Governments were urged to join in greater international efforts in the suppression of piracy on the high seas, and to take appropriate action to protect asylum seekers from acts of violence at sea.²²⁰ Furthermore, all Member States were invited to take appropriate steps for the establishment or, where they already existed, the strengthening of national institutions for the promotion and protection of human rights.²²¹

29. The General Assembly furthermore urged developed countries to make their best efforts to adjust those sectors of their agricultural and manufacturing economies which required protection against exports from developing countries, thus facilitating access to the markets of food and agricultural products.²²² In another instance, the Assembly recommended that Member States adopt measures to ensure the effective participation of all sectors of society, as an integral element in local, regional and national development plans and programmes, with the purpose of securing the effective mobilization and utilization of human resources as well as more equitable distribution of development benefits.²²³ On yet another occasion, the General Assembly solemnly invited Member States, in the exercise of their permanent sovereignty over their natural resources, to conduct their activities in recognition of the supreme importance of protecting natural systems, maintaining the balance and quality of nature and conserving natural resources, in the interests of present and future generations.²²⁴

30. Other specific types of action were further proposed to Member States. The General Assembly called upon Governments to refrain from the supply

of arms and other military assistance to certain countries.²²⁵ Concerning remnants of war, States involved in such wars were called upon to make available all information on the areas where mines were placed.²²⁶ The Assembly also invited States concerned to take appropriate measures to discourage the powerful economic interests aimed at increasing the number of drug abusers, as well as to cooperate in a suitable fashion to prevent the uncontrolled or illicit cultivation, production, export, import, transit and consumption of narcotic drugs or psychotropic substances.²²⁷ The General Assembly urged all Member States to cooperate with one another and with the World Health Organization to ensure that the necessary international action was taken to implement the Global Strategy for Health for All by the Year 2000 as part of the fulfilment of the International Development Strategy for the Third United Nations Development Decade.²²⁸ The Assembly furthermore urged developed countries to refrain from adopting measures aimed at exerting coercion or pressure in order to interfere in the exercise of the sovereign rights of the developing countries.²²⁹

31. In addition to urging measures, including legislation, to combat prostitution and its exploitation, the General Assembly appealed to Member States to provide special protection to victims of prostitution through measures including education, social guarantees and employment opportunities for those victims with a view to their rehabilitation.²³⁰ The Assembly invited developing countries to coordinate their efforts and policies in order to facilitate world industrial restructuring and redeployment, and urged developed countries to pursue appropriate positive adjustment policies and measures that facilitated world industrial restructuring with minimal disruptions, seeking to avoid negative effects on the industrial development of developing countries.²³¹ The Assembly furthermore appealed to Governments to promote the establishment of appropriate facilities for child care and education of children as a means of combining motherhood with economic, political, social, cultural and other activities of women and thus to provide assistance to women in integrating fully into their societies.²³²

(c) *Actions proposed to organs, organizations and bodies of the United Nations system*

32. The General Assembly also proposed certain actions that organizations in the United Nations system should take in regard to resolutions which the Assembly adopted. For instance, on the question of the development of international cooperation, the

United Nations organs, organizations and bodies concerned were requested to continue their analytical work devoted to the examination of long-term economic and social trends and to make it available in the process of the formulation of economic policies and decision-making.²³³ The appropriate United Nations bodies were urged, within their mandates, to take timely and effective action in existing and future cases of mass and flagrant violations of human rights.²³⁴

33. All relevant organs, organizations and bodies of the United Nations system were urged to expand their training programmes.²³⁵ All international organizations, as well as organs, organizations and bodies of the United Nations system were urged to take into account the World Conservation Strategy, launched in March 1980, in developing their policies and programmes.²³⁶ The organs, organizations and bodies of the United Nations system engaged in operational activities for development were invited to adopt appropriate measures leading to a greater use of the capacities of developing countries in local or regional procurement of material and equipment, in training and in services, in facilitating the increased use of local contractors and in the recruitment of training, technical and managerial personnel.²³⁷ The organs, organizations and bodies of the United Nations system were requested to participate fully in and support the implementation of the Nairobi Programme of Action for the Development and Utilization of New and Renewable Sources of Energy.²³⁸

34. The executive secretaries of the regional commissions were urged to increase the effectiveness of the programme of their exchanges of staff in order to foster the broader scheme of interregional cooperation.²³⁹ The executive heads of organs, organizations and bodies of the United Nations system were urged to seek to minimize administrative and other support costs with a view to increasing the proportion of resources available to improve the programme delivery to developing countries.²⁴⁰ The interested bodies of the United Nations and specialized agencies were called upon to pay continuous attention to the promotion of human rights and their enjoyment by youth, particularly the right to education and vocational training and to work, with a view to resolving the problem of youth unemployment.²⁴¹ All organizations of the United Nations system that elaborated guidelines and related documents on specific areas relevant to consumer protection were requested to distribute them to the appropriate bodies of individual States.²⁴²

35. Various types of action were also recommended to other bodies of the United Nations system. For example, the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization was requested to continue its valuable efforts to find suitable solutions for the problems relating to the return or restitution of cultural property to the countries of origin²⁴³ and to undertake, in cooperation with Governments, rigorous efforts to spread the teaching of human rights in all educational institutions, particularly primary and secondary schools, as well as in the training of relevant professional groups.²⁴⁴ The United Nations Environment Programme was requested to take into consideration the provisions of the International Development Strategy for the Third United Nations Development Decade and to continue to promote the concept of sustainable ecological development, in particular through the integration of environmental concerns in development programmes and projects.²⁴⁵ The United Nations Development Programme was requested to consider measures to enhance the capacity of the United Nations Capital Development Fund to respond effectively to the priority needs of the least developed countries,²⁴⁶ as well as to continue to intensify efforts to restrain administrative expenditures in order to maximize programme delivery.²⁴⁷ The World Health Organization was requested, in the light of the experience of the International Year of Disabled Persons, to review its definitions of impairment, disability and handicap in consultation with organizations of disabled persons and other appropriate bodies.²⁴⁸ The World Tourism Organization was requested, in cooperation with the United Nations system, to continue its efforts towards the future development and promotion of tourism, especially in the developing countries.²⁴⁹

36. In another example, the Committee on Missing Persons in Cyprus was urged to proceed with its investigative work for the tracing of and accounting for missing persons in Cyprus.²⁵⁰ The General Assembly urged the United Nations Children's Fund to continue and intensify its efforts regarding the basic-services approach for children on the basis of recent developments in the social and biological sciences which presented a new opportunity to bring about a virtual revolution in child survival and child development, at a low cost and in a relatively short time.²⁵¹ The United Nations Fund for Population Activities was urged, in cooperation with all organizations responsible for international population assistance, to continue its assistance, within its mandate, in the field of aging, particularly in developing countries.²⁵² The United Nations Conference on Trade and Development was requested, in view of its key role in the area of

economic cooperation among developing countries, to continue to intensify activities in that area, in accordance with its mandate.²⁵³ The United Nations Industrial Development Organization was requested to continue, in accordance with its mandate, to work in close cooperation and collaboration with the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development and relevant international organizations in industrial restructuring and redeployment.²⁵⁴

(d) *Actions proposed to the Economic and Social Council*

37. With regard to actions proposed to the Economic and Social Council, the General Assembly expressed hope that the Council would take steps to consider as soon as possible reports submitted by States parties under the provisions of the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights.²⁵⁵ In one instance, on the question of the establishment of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization, the General Assembly requested the Council to arrange for the negotiation with the new agency of an agreement to constitute it as a specialized agency in accordance with Articles 57 and 63 of the Charter of the United Nations, to enter into such agreement subject to the approval of the General Assembly and to arrange for the provisional application of the agreement as appropriate.²⁵⁶ On another occasion, the General Assembly requested the Council to give continuous attention to the problems of the unemployment of youth and to resolving them.²⁵⁷

38. The General Assembly also invited the Council to give due consideration to the implementation of the recommendations on the social aspects of the development activities of the United Nations.²⁵⁸ In other recommendations, the Assembly requested the Council and its subsidiary organs to devote greater attention to the problems of elevating the status of rural women²⁵⁹ and to the problem of prostitution and the means for preventing it.²⁶⁰ Requests were also made for the Council to undertake or to continue, on an appropriate basis, the review, monitoring and appraisal of the World Population Plan of Action, in order to provide overall policy guidelines within the United Nations system on population questions.²⁶¹

39. The General Assembly furthermore requested the Council to take charge, with the help of the Secretary-General, of coordinating the implementation of the Programme of Action and of evaluating the activities undertaken during the Second Decade to Combat Racism and Racial discrimination.²⁶² In the area of narcotic drugs, the Assembly requested the Council, considering Articles 62(3) and 66(1) of the Charter of

the United Nations and Council resolution 9(I), to have the Commission on Narcotic Drugs initiate as a priority matter the preparation of a draft convention against illicit traffic in narcotic drugs.²⁶³ The Council was further requested, through the Commission on Narcotic Drugs, to consider the legal, institutional and social elements relevant to all aspects of combating drug trafficking, including the possibility of convening a specialized conference.²⁶⁴

(e) *Actions proposed to the Secretary-General*

40. Types of action proposed to the Secretary-General, in addition to undertaking studies and submitting reports, were to "take or continue to take the necessary measures",²⁶⁵ "continue his efforts",²⁶⁶ "dispatch or send a mission",²⁶⁷ "prepare a draft programme for the observance of an International Year",²⁶⁸ "use his best endeavours in some cases",²⁶⁹ "draw the concerns expressed in a resolution to the attention of all Governments, regional and interregional organizations and specialized agencies",²⁷⁰ "implement or continue the implementation of recommendations",²⁷¹ "transmit the text of a resolution",²⁷² "give due attention",²⁷³ "give or continue to give full cooperation and support",²⁷⁴ "submit specific proposals",²⁷⁵ "explore ways and means of ensuring substantial increases in contributions from extrabudgetary sources including bilateral donors"²⁷⁶ and "provide all necessary assistance".²⁷⁷

41. During the period under review, the Secretary-General was requested to keep under consideration the question of redesignating the Division of Human Rights as a Centre for Human Rights, making such redesignation when he deemed it appropriate.²⁷⁸ With respect to the situation in Kampuchea, the Secretary-General was to follow the situation closely and exercise his good offices in order to contribute to a peaceful solution of the problem.²⁷⁹ In another instance, the Secretary-General was requested to maintain close cooperation with the Secretary-General of the Organization of African Unity on the matter of the elaboration of an African Charter of Human Rights and of the establishment of an African Commission on Human Rights.²⁸⁰ There was also the occasion where the Secretary-General was requested to take measures through appropriate channels on the dissemination of information on a convention with the aim of promoting further ratification thereof or accession thereto.²⁸¹

42. Other types of action were further envisaged by the General Assembly. For instance, the Secretary-General was requested to take the necessary steps to associate the United Nations with the activities of the

United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization directed towards the return or restitution of cultural property to the countries of origin, including the mobilization for that purpose of the United Nations information media.²⁸² Along with the Executive Director of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization, the Secretary-General was requested to expand and develop programmes concerning the least developed as well as landlocked and island developing countries.²⁸³ The Secretary-General was requested to ensure that the United Nations system was responsive to assisting developing countries in strengthening their capabilities with respect to coordination.²⁸⁴ In the area of mobilizing women in development, the Secretary-General was requested to ensure that linkage was made to the review and appraise progress towards implementing the International Development Strategy for the Third United Nations Development Decade.²⁸⁵

43. On the question of reverse transfer of technology, the Secretary-General was requested to keep under continued review the coordination of work in the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development, the International Labour Organization and other relevant United Nations organizations.²⁸⁶ Within the United Nations system, recruitment of more disabled persons was to be promoted,²⁸⁷ while the Secretary-General was requested, in consultation with the executive secretaries of the five regional commissions, to reassess all individual work programmes, with a view to incorporating women's concerns at all levels of each commission.²⁸⁸
