# TEXT OF ARTICLE 62 (4)

It [the Economic and Social Council] may call, in accordance with the rules prescribed by the United Nations, international conferences on matters falling within its competence.

## INTRODUCTORY NOTE

1. The material contained in this study relates only to the calling of conferences by the Economic and Social Council on matters falling within its competence. As in the Repertory, no reference has been made here to conferences called by the General Assembly on matters also falling within the Council's competence. 1/ No significant questions have arisen during the period under review which would have required inclusion under the "Analytical Summary of Practice".

#### I. GENERAL SURVEY

#### A. General

- 2. During the period under review, the Economic and Social Council has convened four conferences of States. 2/ In addition, the Secretary-General, pursuant to authority granted under Council resolutions 296 (XI), 462 A (XV) and 557 F (XVIII), has convened four conferences on primary commodity problems. 3/
- 3. The international conferences of States called by the Council 4/ have dealt with questions concerning slavery and related practices, maintenance obligations, foreign arbitral awards, and cartography. Three 5/ of the conferences were called for the purpose of concluding international conventions; in one case, 6/ the conference was asked in addition "to consider, if time permits, other possible measures for increasing the effectiveness of arbitration in the settlement of private law disputes and to make such recommendations as it may deem desirable".

The General Assembly also recommended in December 1955 (resolution 912 (X)) that a second international conference for the exchange of technical information regarding the peaceful uses of atomic energy should be held under the auspices of the United Nations in two or three years time.

Two of these conferences had not been held during the period under review, namely, the Second Regional Cartographic Conference for Asia and the Far East (E S C resolution 600 (XXI)), which is to be held in 1958 in Tokyo, and the Conference of Plenipotentiaries to conclude a convention on the recognition and enforcement of foreign arbitral awards (E S C resolution 604 (XXI)), which is to be held at Headquarters in 1958.

# C. Invitations and participation in connexion with international conferences of States

#### 1. Member States and non-member States

4. The Council has invited or requested the Secretary-General to invite States Members of the United Nations and members of the specialized agencies to participate in all of the international conferences it has called during the period under review. In the case of the conference called to conclude a convention on the recognition and enforcement of foreign arbitral awards, the Council has, in addition, decided to invite other States which are parties to the Statute of the International Court of Justice.

5. The Council has invited interested specialized agencies to three conferences. 7/1 In two 8/1 of these conferences, non-governmental organizations in consultative status with the Council, as well as specified organizations, were invited to attend.

6. The Secretary-General was asked by the Council to invite not only the specialized agencies but also "other inter-governmental organizations" to the Second Regional Cartographic Conference for Asia and the Far East. 9/
