Anthony Aust studied law at the London School of Economics (LSE) and is a solicitor. He was for 35 years a legal adviser with the Foreign and Commonwealth Office, retiring in 2002 as Deputy Legal Adviser. From 1988-1991, he was the Legal Adviser (Counsellor) to the United Kingdom Mission to the United Nations in New York. Afterwards, he advised the FCO's UN, Middle East and Counter-Terrorism Departments. For the last 10 years he worked on all legal aspects of Lockerbie.

In 2007, Cambridge University Press published the second edition of his *Modern Treaty Law and Practice*. (The first edition (2000) was also translated into Chinese.) In 2005, his *Handbook of International Law* was also published by Cambridge University Press. A second edition will be published in 2010. He also writes articles, and chapters of books, on international law

He has taught international law at LSE, University College, London, the School of Oriental and African Studies, Westminster University and Notre Dame (London), and at other universities and institutions in the United Kingdom and abroad. He teaches and writes on the subject from a practical perspective, in particular how it may be useful in dealing with actual problems. He is a consultant to governments, international organisations and companies.
