

**MR. CHRISTIAN TOMUSCHAT**

*Professor emeritus at Humboldt University, Berlin*

Christian Tomuschat is professor emeritus of Humboldt University Berlin. Before taking the chair of international law in Berlin, he worked for 22 years at the Law Faculty of the University of Bonn as the director of the Institute of international law. From 1977 to 1986, he was a member of the Human Rights Committee under the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights; from 1985 to 1996, he served on the International Law Commission (President in 1992). From 1990 to 1993, he was the rapporteur of the United Nations Human Rights Commission on the human rights situation in Guatemala; during the period from 1997 to 1999, he coordinated the Commission for Historical Clarification of that country. He has gained judicial experience as judge of the administrative tribunals of the Interamerican Development Bank and the African Development Bank. As legal counsel, he has represented the Federal Government before the Court of Justice of the European Communities in Luxemburg, the European Court of Human Rights in Strasbourg and the International Court of Justice.

Christian Tomuschat served as a member of the International Commission of Jurists (Geneva) from 1981 to 1996. He was the President of the German Society of International Law from 1993 to 1997. He was admitted to the Institut de droit international in 1997.

He is the author of numerous books and articles. Among his recent publications are: *Human Rights – Between Idealism and Realism*, Oxford 2003 (2<sup>nd</sup> ed. 2008); *The Statute of the International Court of Justice. A Commentary*, Oxford 2006 (co-editor and author).
