

MR. PAVEL ŠTURMA

Pavel Šturma is Professor of International Law and Head of the Department of Public International Law, Charles University (Prague), Faculty of Law, and coordinator of the Research Centre for Human Rights (UNCE) at the same University. He has also been Researcher, later Senior Research Fellow of the Institute of Law, Czech Academy of Sciences in Prague. He also was visiting professor at the Pan European University, Faculty of Law in Bratislava. At the Charles University he teaches courses on Public International Law, International Criminal Law, International Economic Law and Codification of International Law. He is also involved in English programmes organized at the Law Faculty for LL.M. and Erasmus students. In 2006-2013, he also served as Vice-dean for Research and Publication Activities.

He is member and Special Rapporteur of the UN International Law Commission, member of the Permanent Court of Arbitration. He also serves as President of the Czech Society of International Law and Editor-in-Chief of the Czech Yearbook of Public & Private International Law. He is author or co-author of 16 books and more than 150 articles and studies in Public International Law. His books include *The International Criminal Court and Suppression of Crimes under International Law* (Prague, 2002), *International Economic Law* (Prague, 2013, with V. Balaš), *Immunities of States and Their Officials in Contemporary International Law* (Passau-Berlin-Prague, 2017). The main topics of his research include general international law, the codification of international law, international responsibility and international investment law.

Before entering the Charles University on full basis, Šturma worked as an UN staff member at the United Nations Office in Vienna (UNDCP). Graduated from Charles University Faculty of Law and Faculty of Arts (Philosophy and Economics), he continued the postgraduate (PhD.) studies at the Institute of Law of the Czechoslovak

Academy of Sciences, and at the IHEI of Université Paris 2 (Panthéon-Assas). Later, he was also admitted to the Czech Bar Association. Occasionally, he acted as legal expert and expert witness in some international investment arbitrations.
