Kristina Daugirdas is a Professor of Law at the University of Michigan Law School. She teaches and writes about international law, international institutions, and U.S. foreign relations law. Professor Daugirdas is a member of the editorial board for the *International Organizations Law Review*.

In 2016-2017, Professor Daugirdas was a Visiting Fellow at the Graduate Institute in Geneva and worked as a consultant for the World Intellectual Property Organization. From 2014-2017, she co-authored the Contemporary Practice of the United States section of the *American Journal of International Law*. In 2014, Professor Daugirdas was awarded the Francis Deák Prize for an outstanding article published in the *American Journal of International Law* by a younger author.

Before joining the Michigan Law faculty, Professor Daugirdas served as an attorney-adviser at the U.S. Department of State and as a law clerk to Judge Stephen F. Williams of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit. She earned her JD, *magna cum laude*, from the New York University School of Law, and her AB, with honors, from Brown University.
