Diane Desierto specializes in public international law and international dispute settlement mechanisms such as international investment and commercial arbitration, international economic law (trade, finance, investment, and development), international human rights and international humanitarian law in the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), maritime security, and the emerging field of ASEAN Law applicable to Southeast Asian states and their external partners. She is also 2016-2017 Faculty Fellow at the Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences (CASBS) at Stanford University and Adjunct Research Fellow at the WSD Handa Center for Human Rights and International Justice at Stanford Global Studies; 2016-2019 External Executive Director of UP Law Graduate School at Bonifacio Global City (BGC), Philippines; 2016-2017 EURAXESS Visiting Scientist at UNICA (Italy); Professor of International Law at the Philippine Supreme Court's Judicial Academy Corps of Professors; and 2017 Summer Session Director of Studies for Public International Law at the Hague Academy of International Law.

She serves as a frequent Legal Expert for the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) Secretariat and other ASEAN institutions (such as the ASEAN Coordinating Committee on Investment, ASEAN-China Working Group on the Code of Conduct for the South China Sea, ASEAN Legal Affairs Division) on international economic law, maritime security, human rights, legal harmonization and institutional coordination and law reform matters. She is regularly engaged for her expertise in international economic law and ASEAN law by the European Union External Action Service, the United States Agency for International Development, the Asian Development Bank, the Government of Japan Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Senate of the Republic of the Philippines and the Philippine Supreme Court. She also advises Southeast Asian public agencies and private institutions on ASEAN regulations, evolving ASEAN institutions, and inter-State disputes affecting Southeast Asia.

Ms. Desierto is a Member of the Inaugural Panel of International Arbitrators of the British Virgin Islands International Arbitration Centre (BVI IAC), and Arbitration Partner in a Manila-based boutique law firm (Desierto & Desierto Law), where she is officially ranked by Who's Who Legal and *Global Arbitration Review* as among the "world's leading arbitration specialists" listed in their *Future Leaders in International Arbitration 45 under 45*. She is a Member of the Scientific Advisory Board of the European Journal of International Law and Permanent Editor of EJIL:Talk!; Editor of the Asian Yearbook of International Law and Honorary Editor of the Indonesian Journal of International and Comparative Law; Academic Council Member of the Institute of Transnational Arbitration; Co-Chair of the Oxford Investment Claims Summer Academy at St. Anne's College, University of Oxford; Convenor of the International Economic Law & Development Interest Group of the Asian Society of International Law (AsianSIL) and Member of the AsianSIL Research Committee; Member of the International Board of Advisers of the Nepal International Law Center; and Legal Expert on the Right to Development for International Economic Treaties for the UN OHCHR and UPEACE. Before her appointment to the University of Notre Dame University of Hawaii Richardson School of Law, she was Professor of International Law at Peking University School of Transnational Law, University of the Philippines College of Law, and Lyceum of the Philippines Law.

Her books include *Necessity and National Emergency Clauses: Sovereignty in Modern Treaty Interpretation* (Martinus Nijhoff, 2012, winner of the Ambrose Gherini Prize in International Law); *Public Policy in International Economic Law: The ICESCR in Trade, Finance, and Investment* (Oxford University Press, 2015); *International Commercial Arbitration and Philippine Law: Jurisdiction and Admissibility* (UP IILS, 2016); *ASEAN Law and Regional Integration: Governance and the Rule of Law in Southeast Asia's Single Market* (Routledge, forthcoming 2017); *ASEAN Integration Through Law: Treaties in the Philippine System* (Cambridge University Press, forthcoming); *Commentary on the Code of Professional Responsibility* (USAID and ABA, 2007). Other books slated for completion are *Postmodern Reparations in International Law* (2017); *The Cambridge Textbook on International Economic Law* (with Freya Baetens and Michael Waibel, CUP 2017); *The Constitution of the Philippines: A Contextual*

Ms. Desierto was a former Yale Law Clerk at the International Court of Justice (2010-2011), 2012 Grotius Postdoctoral Research Fellow, University of Michigan Law School, Howard M.
