Larissa van den Herik is Professor of Public International Law at Leiden University's Grotius Centre for International Legal Studies. She is also the vice-president of the Advisory Committee on Public International Law Matters to the Dutch government. She has advised the government in that capacity on matters including cyberwarfare and the legality of the use of armed drones. She is general editor (and former editor-in-chief 2005-2013) of the *Leiden Journal of International Law*. She has contributed to the Watson reports on sanctions and due process of 2006, 2009 and 2012 and she directed the process that led to the *Leiden Policy Recommendations on Counter-Terrorism and International Law* (2010).

Larissa van den Herik holds a law degree from VU University Amsterdam, where she also received her doctorate in law (PhD) in 2005. Her areas of expertise include the international law on peace and security, international criminal law, and general international law. She is the author of several publications in these fields, published in leading law journals such as the *Journal of International Criminal Justice*, *International Organizations Law Review*, *Criminal Law Forum*, *International Criminal Law Review*. She has published and edited several books, including *Counter-Terrorism Strategies in a Fragmented Legal Order: Meeting the Challenges*, CUP, 2013; and *The Diversification and Fragmentation of International Criminal Law*, Martinus Nijhoff, 2012.

At Leiden University, Larissa van den Herik teaches the courses *Capita Selecta on Public International Law* in the Advanced Master Program in Public International Law, and *International Criminal Law* in the Regular Masters Program.
