

MR. FRÉDÉRIC MÉGRET

Mr. Frédéric Mégret is a Full Professor and the holder of the Hans & Tamar Oppenheimer Chair in Public International Law at the Faculty of Law, McGill University where he is a member and co-directed the Centre for Human Rights and Legal Pluralism.

Previously he was a William Dawson Scholar from 2015 to 2023, and the holder of the Canada Research Chair on the Law of Human Rights and Legal Pluralism from 2006 to 2015. He has served as the James S. Carpentier Visiting Professor at Columbia Law School, as a visiting professor at Sciences Po Paris Law School, a Distinguished Visitor at the Faculty of Law of the University of Toronto and as a Senior Fellow at Melbourne University Faculty of Law.

He holds an honorary doctorate from the University of Copenhagen. Previously, he was an Assistant Professor at the Faculty of Law of the University of Toronto, a Boulton fellow at McGill University and a research associate at the European University Institute in Florence.

He holds a doctorate in international law from the University of Paris I (Panthéon Sorbonne) and the Graduate Institute of International Studies in Geneva, an LLB from King's College London and is a graduate of SciencesPo Paris.

He is the author of, among others, *Interference in Sovereign Affairs and the Discursive Economy of International Law* (Brill, 2025) and the co-editor of *The Oxford Handbook on International Criminal Law* (Oxford University Press, 2020).
