

MR. MAURICE MENDELSON

*Queen's Counsel and Emeritus Professor of International Law
University of London*

Maurice Mendelson is a barrister (Queen's Counsel) at Blackstone Chambers, London, specializing in public international law. He has been in practice at the English and international Bar since 1971; from 1968 to 2001 he also held academic posts at the Universities of Oxford and London, most recently the Chair of International Law at University College, London University, of which he is now Emeritus Professor of International Law. He has represented and advised numerous governments, inter-governmental and non-governmental organizations, multinational and other corporations, and individuals, covering most branches of international law. He has also sat as an arbitrator, and given expert evidence before foreign courts and international tribunals. His special interests include customary international law: he was the Chairman of the ILA International Committee that produced the 2000 London Principles on the formation of Customary (General) International Law, and also (inter alia) gave a course of lectures at The Hague Academy on the subject, published as "The Formation of Customary International Law", 272 *Collected Courses* (1998), 155-410.
