Cezary Mik is Professor of International Law and European Law and the Head of the Chair of International and European Law at the Faculty of Law and Administration, Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński University, Warsaw. He has been the legal expert in international and EU law at the Chancellery of Sejm (parliament) since 1997 and at the State Environmental Protection Institute since 2017. He is also a member of the Maritime Law Commission at the Polish Academy of Sciences (Gdańsk) and holds the position of president of the Advisory Committee of the Minister of Foreign Affairs.

Professor Mik's areas of interest include the theory of international law (especially the theory of sources, norms and obligations, e.g. customary international law, jus cogens, pacta sunt servanda, and obligations erga omnes), substantive international law (human rights, law of the sea, and organizations of regional economic integration), EU law (international law aspects of the functioning of the EU, EU legal order, internal market, and maritime law), and the impact of social processes on the international community and international law (internationalization, integration, and globalization).

Professor Mik is the author of many books, articles and opinions for different state institutions and law firms in the field of international law and EU law. He is the Editor-in-Chief of the Polish Review of International and European Law. He also serves as an arbitrator of the Permanent Court of Arbitration and as an arbitrator and conciliator of the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea.
