Ms. Alina Miron is Professor of International Law at the University of Angers (France) and co-director of the Master of International and European Law. She is also a partner at *FAR Avocats*.

She has acted as Counsel and Advocate in a number of cases before the International Court of Justice, the International Tribunal of the Law of the Sea and arbitral tribunals (inter alia, *Maritime Delimitation in the Indian Ocean (Somalia v. Kenya)*, *Delimitation of the Maritime Boundary in the Atlantic Ocean (Ghana/ Côte d'Ivoire)*, *Whaling in the Antarctic (Australia v. Japan: New Zealand intervening)*, *Case concerning the Temple of Preah Vihear (Cambodia v. Thailand)* and *In the Matter of an Arbitration under the Arbitration Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Croatia and the Government of the Republic of Slovenia, signed on 4 November 2009*).

Professor Miron's research covers areas like proceedings before international courts and tribunals, the law of international organizations and the application of international law by domestic judges. Most recently, she has been focusing on law of the sea issues. Among her latest publications: she is a co-author with Alain Pellet and Mathias Forteau of the 9<sup>th</sup> edition of *Droit international public* (LGDJ, 2022) and with Christine Chinkin, of the commentaries to Articles 62 and 63 in *Statute of the International Court of Justice: A commentary*, edited by Andreas Zimmermann and Christian J. Tams. She is also the leading editor of the recently published *Atlas des espaces maritimes de la France* (Pedone, 2022).
