DR. ROGER O'KEEFE is a Senior Lecturer in Law and the Deputy Director of the Lauterpacht Centre for International Law at the University of Cambridge, as well as a Visiting Professor at the Central European University in Budapest. He has published and lectured widely on international criminal law, international humanitarian law, international human rights law and international cultural heritage law, as well as on topics of general interest in public international law such as the sources of international law, the law of treaties, the relationship between international and domestic law, statehood and admission to the United Nations, title to territory, jurisdiction and immunities, state responsibility and the advisory jurisdiction of the International Court of Justice. In 2004 he was awarded the Giorgio La Pira Prize by the *Journal of International Criminal Justice* for his article 'Universal Jurisdiction: Clarifying the Basic Concept', and in 2009 he was a member and the co-rapporteur of the African Union-European Union Technical Ad hoc Expert Group on the Principle of Universal Jurisdiction. He has taught on the United Nations International Law Fellowship Programme in The Hague, and in 2008 he was the anglophone Director of Studies on the Summer Programme in Public International Law at the Hague Academy of International Law.
