Diego Rodríguez-Pinzón is Professorial Lecturer and Co-Director of the Academy on Human Rights and Humanitarian Law at American University, Washington College of Law, in Washington DC. He teaches courses in the fields of human rights law, international law and comparative law. Prof. Rodríguez Pinzón is member of the *U.N. Committee against Torture*, elected for the term 2018-2021. He served as *Ad Hoc* Judge in the Inter-American Court of Human Rights of the Organization of American States (OAS) from 2007 to 2011. He was also staff attorney at the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights of the OAS and has litigated several cases before international mechanisms on issues related to impunity, rule of law and human rights. He holds a law degree from *Universidad de Los Andes* law school in Colombia, as well as a Master degree (LL.M.) from the American University, Washington College of Law, and a Doctoral degree (S.J.D.) from George Washington University Law School.

He has been invited faculty to the annual summer Study Session of the René Cassin International Institute of Human Rights, in Strasbourg, France, and the Åbo Akademi Institute for Human Rights in Turku, Finland, among other prestigious international programs. He has lectured in academic institutions of Argentina, Australia, Belgium, Bolivia, Brazil, Canada, China, Colombia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Egypt, El Salvador, England, Finland, France, Germany, Guatemala, Honduras, Ireland, Mexico, Nigeria, Panama, Peru, Sweden, South Africa, Spain, Switzerland, The Netherlands, The Philippines, Turkey and Venezuela. As correspondent for the British periodical Butterworths Human Rights Cases, Professor Rodríguez-Pinzón covers the Americas. He has served as international legal consultant for USAID, the Inter-American Development Bank (IADB), the Organization of American States (OAS), United Nations, among other institutions.
