Natalino Ronzitti is the Chair of International Law at "LUISS" (Rome) and an advisory expert for IAI. He was "Professeur invité" at the "University of Paris II", and has often been a guest professor at the "University of Alessandria" in Egypt. He has participated in conferences at numerous foreign universities and institutes, and given a course in International Law at Den Hague. He has been an advisor to the Ministries of Foreign Affairs and of Defence, and legal advisor to the Italian Mission at the Conference on Disarmament in Geneva. He is an 'Associate member' of the Institut de droit international.
