Dr. Hsien-Li Tan is Assistant Prof at the Law Faculty, National University of Singapore, and Senior Research Fellow and Executive Director of the ASEAN Integration through Law Project at the Centre for International Law, NUS. Hsien-Li is also the Editor of the Asian Journal of International Law. Hsien-Li has held fellowships at the European University Institute, Florence; the Jean Monnet Center for International and Regional Economic Law and Justice, NYU School of Law. She was previously the AsianSIL Research Fellow at the NUS School of Law and the Ushiba Memorial ASEAN Fellow in Tokyo working on Japan's human security policy's impact on Southeast Asia. Hsien-Li researches on the role and the rule of law and institutions in ASEAN Integration; public international law, particularly on institution-building and norm-creation; as well as human rights and peace and security.

Hsien-Li wrote the first book on the ASEAN human rights system (Cambridge University Press, 2011) and co-wrote "Promoting Compliance: The Role of Dispute Settlement and Monitoring Mechanisms in ASEAN Instruments" (with Bob Beckman, Leo Bernard, Hao Duy Phan, Ranyta Yusran) (Cambridge University Press, February 2016). Her second book on human rights in ASEAN with Alison Duxbury is forthcoming in 2017. Hsien-Li is currently working on two more books – the documentary analysis of ASEAN instruments and a theory of the ASEAN Way. Hsien-Li is the general co-editor (together with Joseph Weiler) of the ASEAN Integration Through Law Book Series (Cambridge University Press). With her team, she is also establishing a teaching programme on ASEAN Law and Policy for capacity-building and public education in the region.
