### **Biographical Summary**

Professor Dr. Charles C. Jalloh has been nominated by Sierra Leone for re-election to a second term for one of the nine African seats on the International Law Commission (“ILC”) in the November 2021 UN General Assembly election. He has also been co-nominated by Chile and New Zealand, making him the only African international lawyer nominated for an African seat by three member states from three UN regions. His candidature for re-election to the ILC was endorsed by the African Union in October 2020.

Dr. Jalloh is currently Professor of International Law at Florida International University (“FIU”), Miami, USA, and Founding Editor of the *African Journal of Legal Studies* and the *African Journal of International Criminal Justice*. Elected by the UN General Assembly as a member of the ILC for the term which began in January 2017, Professor Jalloh is only the second Sierra Leonean to have been honored with election to the ILC. He is an active contributor to all aspects of the ILC’s work. In addition to successfully advancing proposals in various working groups and lecturing and supervising jurists in the ILC’s International Law Seminar as well as in the UN Regional Course in International Law, he has been elected by his peers to leadership positions in the Bureau of the ILC as Chairperson of the Drafting Committee for the 70th (2018) session and as Rapporteur for the 71st (2019) session.

A prolific scholar, Professor Jalloh has published widely on issues of international law including over 70 articles, book chapters and essays in top peer-reviewed journals such as *American Journal of International Law*, *Case Western Reserve Journal of International Law*, *International Criminal Law Review*, *Journal of International Criminal Justice*, *Michigan Journal of International Law* and *Vanderbilt Journal of Transnational Law*. He has also been a (lead or co) editor or author of 14 books with top scholarly presses. These include *The Legal Legacy of the Special Court for Sierra Leone* (Cambridge University Press, 2020); *The African Court of Justice and Human and Peoples’ Rights in Context: Development and Challenges* (Cambridge University Press, 2019); *Africa and the International Criminal Court* (Oxford University Press, 2017); *The International Criminal Court in an Effective Global System* (Edward Elgar, 2016); *The Sierra Leone Special Court and Its Legacy: The Impact for Africa and International Criminal Law* (Cambridge University Press, 2015); *Shielding Humanity: Essays in International Law in Honour of Judge Abdul Koroma* (Martinus Nijhoff, 2015); and *Promoting Accountability Under International Law for Gross Human Rights Violations in Africa: Essays in Honour of Prosecutor Hassan Bubacar Jallow* (Martinus Nijhoff, 2015).

Professor Jalloh’s scholarly works have been cited by legal scholars, practitioners, and judges. He is also a recipient of many research grants and academic awards such as the RJ Reynolds Distinguished Visiting Professorship from North Carolina Central University School of Law (2010), the Buchannan Ingersoll & Rooney Faculty Scholar Award from the University of Pittsburgh Law School (2013-2014), the FIU Top Scholar Award (2015), the FIU Senate Faculty Award for Excellence in Research and Creative Activities (2018) and the Fulbright Lund Distinguished Chair in Public International Law (2018-2019) from Lund University and the Raoul Wallenberg Institute of Human Rights and Humanitarian Law in Sweden.

Professor Jalloh brings both scientific rigor and relevant practical experience to the work of the ILC. Before academia, he distinguished himself as a legal practitioner at the national and international levels. His practice experience includes as Counsel, Department of Justice Canada and the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade; Associate Legal Officer in the Trial Chamber of the UN International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda working on high profile cases involving the 1994 Rwandan genocide; as the Legal Adviser/Duty Counsel in the UN-backed Special Court for Sierra Leone in Freetown and in The Hague, and as a Visiting Professional at the International Criminal Court (“ICC”). Called to the Bar as a Barrister and Solicitor in Ontario, Canada in 2004, he has advised governments and international organizations on diverse issues of domestic and

international law and appeared in proceedings before international criminal tribunals. Between 2012-2014, he served as co-chair of the International Criminal Law Interest Group of the American Society of International Law, and between 2014-2016, was a Rapporteur for the International Law Association's Committee on Complementarity in International Criminal Law. He has been a member of the Advisory Panel to the President of the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia and the Advisory Board of the War Crimes Committee of the International Bar Association.

For several years, Professor Jalloh was an independent expert for the African Union Commission on international and regional law and twice appeared as an external counsel representing African States before the ICC's Appeals Chamber. In 2019-2020, he chaired the Panel of Experts assisting the Committee on the Election of the Prosecutor established by the ICC Assembly of States Parties. He is currently a member of the Sierra Leone National Group for the Nomination of Candidates as Judges of the International Court of Justice, the Council of Advisers on the Application of the Rome Statute to Cyberwarfare, a member of the Advisory Board of eyewitness to Atrocities and the Founder of the Center for International Law and Policy in Africa. He recently completed service on the Independent Expert Panel for the Legal Definition of Ecocide and the Advisory Board of the American Society of International Law's Taskforce on Policy Options for US Engagement with the ICC. His education includes law degrees in Common Law and Civil Law, a Master's from the University of Oxford and a Ph.D. in International Law from the University of Amsterdam.
