



REGIONAL COURSE IN INTERNATIONAL LAW FOR LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN

Programme of Assistance in the Teaching, Study, Dissemination and Wider Appreciation of International Law

16 May to 7 June 2024

GENERAL INFORMATION

The United Nations Regional Courses in International Law are conducted under the United Nations Programme of Assistance in the Teaching, Study, Dissemination and Wider Appreciation of International Law. The United Nations Programme of Assistance was established by General Assembly resolution 2099 (XX) of 20 December 1965 to contribute towards a better knowledge of international law as a means of strengthening international peace and security and promoting friendly relations and cooperation among States.

The Regional Courses are organized by the Codification Division of the United Nations Office of Legal Affairs. The Regional Course for Latin America and the Caribbean is organized in cooperation with the Government of the Republic of Chile and the United Nations Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC).

OBJECTIVES

The Regional Courses provide high-quality training by prominent international law scholars and practitioners from different regions and legal systems on a broad range of core topics of international law, as well as specific topics of particular interest to the countries in a given region. In addition, the interactive nature of the sessions allows the participants to share experiences and exchange ideas, which promotes greater understanding and cooperation on legal matters in the region.

The Regional Courses are intended to enable qualified professionals, in particular government officials and teachers of international law from developing countries and countries with emerging economies, to deepen their knowledge of international law, and of the legal work of the United Nations.

COURSE CONTENT

The Regional Courses consist of seminars delivered by eminent scholars and practitioners in international law from different regions and legal systems. The curriculum will include seminars on the following core topics, as well as other topics of particular interest to the region: *Introduction to international law, treaty law, State responsibility, diplomatic and consular relations, international peace and security, peaceful settlement of international disputes,*



international human rights law, law of the sea, international humanitarian law, international criminal law, international environmental law, international trade law, international investment law, and the law and institutions of the ECLAC region.

FORMAT AND TRAINING MATERIALS

The Regional Courses are conducted in the form of interactive seminars and discussions to allow for a maximum exchange of views. It is expected that participants take part in the diverse discussions during the Regional Course. A comprehensive set of training materials is provided to each participant at the beginning of the Regional Course. Certificates are awarded to participants who complete the Regional Course in its entirety.

PARTICIPATION/QUALIFICATIONS OF APPLICANTS

To be considered for the Regional Courses, candidates must have a legal background with professional experience in the field of international law. Candidates must also be fluent in the language in which the Course is offered (English). The selected candidates are required to certify that they are able to attend the Regional Course in its entirety. The Regional Course accommodates up to 25 participants.

This Regional Course is open to candidates from the Member States of the United Nations that are members of the Latin American and Caribbean Group.

SELECTION PROCESS

When selecting participants for the Regional Courses, due consideration is given to the candidates' qualifications, to the scope of their professional duties, to the relevance of the training to their professional duties, and to gender balance. Applications from qualified female candidates are encouraged.

VENUE AND COURSE LANGUAGE

The Regional Course for Latin America and the Caribbean will be held in person at the facilities of ECLAC, in Santiago, from 16 May to 7 June 2024. It will be conducted in English. Fluency in spoken and written English is required. Applicants whose mother tongue or language of instruction is not English are required to submit proof of their language abilities and to provide a valid language certification.

FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS AND ACCOMMODATION

For participants receiving a fellowship, the fellowship will cover travel in economy class, accommodation, medical insurance, and training materials. Fellowship recipients will also receive a modest stipend to cover other living expenses in accordance with the policies and procedures governing the administration of United Nations fellowships.

There will also be a limited number of spaces for self-funded participants. With the exception of training materials, self-funded participants bear all costs associated with their participation in the Regional Course (e.g. travel, medical insurance, accommodation and living expenses).

APPLICATION DEADLINE: The deadline has been extended to 9 January 2024.

Incomplete applications and applications received after the deadline will not be considered. The United Nations does not charge a fee at any stage of the application and selection process, and does not require information with respect to candidates' bank accounts.
