ARTICLE 87

TEXT OF ARTICLE 87

The General Assembly and, under its authority, the Trusteeship Council, in carrying out their functions, may:

- a. consider reports submitted by the administering authority;
- b. accept petitions and examine them in consultation with the administering authority;
- c. provide for periodic visits to the respective trust territories at times agreed upon with the administering authority; and
- d. take these and other actions in conformity with the terms of the trusteeship agreements.

NOTE

During the period under review, there were no remaining Trust Territories considered under the authority of the General Assembly. The only remaining Trust Territory was the strategic Territory of the Pacific Islands, which, in accordance with Article 83, was under the authority of the Security Council and acceded to independence in 1994.¹ Accordingly, questions pertaining to the functions of the Trusteeship Council are considered under Article 83.
